Nestled in the Belmont-San Carlos hills, Carlmont High School is a fully accredited comprehensive public high school that supports all students to fulfill their greatest potential. Serving a diverse student body of 2,200 students with a highly qualified, innovative and creative faculty, Carlmont is a California Distinguished School, an honor reserved for a small number of California's "exemplary and inspiring" public schools. On a range of standardized tests, Carlmont students consistently perform better than their peers in the county and the state.

FACILITY & TECHNOLOGY ENHANCEMENTS

Local community support of bonds benefitting the Sequoia Union High School District has made possible many recent and upcoming enhancements to facilities and technology at Carlmont.

- Academic areas: new classrooms for science and social studies and state-of-the-art computer lab
- Athletic programs: new athletic fields, pool and second gym
- **Performing arts:** 21,000-sq.ft., 500-seat performing arts center and visual and performing arts building (scheduled for completion in 2008 and 2010 respectively)
- **Student support:** remodeled Futures Center (guidance and college facility), library and student union as well as new campus security system

ACADEMIC INNOVATIONS & SPECIALTIES

Carlmont is renowned for the depth and breadth of the school's academic program and enrichment opportunities, some of which are highlighted below.

- **Biotech program:** a 3-year college/career pathway recognized as a model in the state, including coursework and laboratory and workplace experience in biotechnology
- Business Technology Academy: a small-learning community (a "school-within-a-school") providing academic and technical skills training to strengthen a student's academic status, skills and career potential
- Cañada at Carlmont: offering extensive college courses on the Carlmont campus
- Career pathways/magnet programs: opportunity to identify and explore college majors and career interests through magnet programs in international business entrepreneurship, science & medicine and education or a pathway of the student's own choosing
- College preparatory focus: a full range of college preparatory classes and more than 20 advanced standing-honors and advanced placement-honors courses, award-winning college preparatory program for students "in the middle," and guidance counseling, college advising, SAT preparation and other free resources to assist with planning for and applying to college (*NOTE:* 96% of Carlmont's 2007-08 graduates went on to college, choosing schools locally and top-tier universities across the country and abroad)

- **Freshman transition:** supporting students (and their parents) in achieving a smooth transition to high school with an all-inclusive program that starts in the seventh grade
- Special support: diverse offerings, ranging from one-on-one and small-group tutoring/study hall and skill-building classes for students below grade level in reading and math to academic planning, coursework and support for English learners and students with special education needs
- Visual and performing arts: vast number of excellent opportunities available (please see details below)
- World languages: classes in French, Mandarin and Spanish
